HOLY FAMILY

*Dear Brothers and Sisters,
August 31st & September 1st*

Today we hear about humility in the readings: In Sirach 3 and in the Gospel reading from Luke 14. In Sirach we hear that a person who conducts themselves with humility is worth more than the giver of gifts.....and that the humble person will find favor with God. Then in Luke we hear a story, told by Jesus, about a dinner where some people try to get the best seats, near the host or at the front, that kind of thing, while some humble people just sit in the back (or as Jesus says "the lowest place"), and Jesus says those humble people will be exalted by God.

Well, what does it mean to be humble? I would say it means to be more concerned about doing good than about getting accolades for what we do. So, to be humble doesn't mean we don't **DO OUR VERY BEST** – in sports or in using our talents or in our jobs or in academics....but it does mean that we don't place so much importance on **DOING WELL**. That we begin to see ourselves as superior to others in some way **BECAUSE** we do well in sports or art or music or our job or in academics.

This phenomenon of "**feeling superior**" can also happen in the Church: That we are superior to others in the spiritual community because of some kind of accomplishment we feel we have made.

In the end, it is good, instead, to stay humble – and being a person of service can help with that. Indeed, among Catholic speakers and teachers, I find that the ones I feel are the best are always the ones who **DO SERVICE** – that they try to help those in need and work to reach out to the poor and forgotten – the mother in a crisis pregnancy, the poor person, the isolated young person, the old person in a nursing home, the person from another country who feels alone. People with an eye for those in-need often can hold onto their humility even while they might become "**well-known**" as a speaker or presenter, etc. They keep their humility, I believe, because they remain committed to service. I believe that being people of service can help us to remain humble, amidst our accomplishments, as well.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK: THE **SECOND** COLLECTION ON THE **SECOND** WEEKEND OF EVERY MONTH, STARTING THE WEEKEND OF OCTOBER 12th-13th will be for **THE DRIVEWAY FUND**. Most parishioners know that we have acquired the whole corner of Davidsonville Road and Central Avenue.

We have also let it be known that we are building a driveway, a second entrance/exit for the Holy Family parking lot. It will come into our property off of Davidsonville Road and into our campus. It will also be accompanied by a large amount of plantings to shield residents near that driveway from light and noise. Most people also know that we have acquired the whole corner of Davidsonville Road and Central Avenue, and we plan, in that corner area, to create a grassy area over a section of it that could serve as a playing field. The projected time for beginning that driveway construction is some time between the Fall of 2020 and the early Spring of 2021.

Between now and that time, we are hoping to put aside funds to pay for the creation of the developed greenspace and the driveway on our campus. One way we hope to do this is to have a specific special collection **EACH MONTH** that will go entirely towards building this driveway. This second collection, beginning in October, will be on the **SECOND** weekend of each month. If you can try to remember, then, to be generous to this second collection each month, it would be a great help to our parish.


