~ Pastor's Note ~

Here at Holy Family we have in Unity Hall one of the most beautiful Church halls in our archdiocese. Are you planning a wedding reception or a wedding anniversary party, a retirement party, a birthday party or a family reunion? Consider using our Unity Hall to gather for your celebration whether it is for 50 people or 250 people. Without a doubt, in this area Unity Hall is one of the most beautiful halls with a large kitchen to host your gathering. Work on the installation of our New HVAC System is on schedule. All of the equipment to be installed has arrived. The plan is to have the HVAC System installed and operational by October 31st.

The cost of the HVAC project is \$630,000. As of August 31st , when I am writing this note early due to the Labor Day holiday and early publication deadlines, we have raised \$151,123.50 in addition to our maintenance reserve of \$50,000, giving us a total of \$201,123.50 or 32% of our goal. I thank you for your support to pay for this large capital expense. I ask for your ongoing financial support so that we can quickly reach our campaign goal.

Months ago we rented Unity Hall out for an event on Saturday, September 16th. Therefore, all of the Masses next weekend, September 16th & 17th will be celebrated in our church so pray that we don't have hot weather over that weekend. The following weekend, September 23rd & 24th, all the Masses will be celebrated in Unity Hall until the HVAC Project is completed.

"That Man is You" is coming to Holy Family starting next Saturday, September 16th. "That Man is You" is for all the men of the parish, providing a forum for building friendships and growth in faith. I invite all men to join us for our kickoff in rooms 12 & 13 for breakfast and fellowship. We will begin at 7am and end soon after 8am.

CARING FOR CREATION: Do you have questions about recycling here in Anne Arundel County. Well of course, there's an app for that: https://www.aacounty.org/public-works/wastemanagement/curbside-collection/what-goes-where. But the point of today's conversation is about the ever-changing and evolving nature of recycling. Most of us, I would hope, now know that recycle symbol on plastics with the number and running arrows around it. First there is #1. Polyethylene There's a good chance you've held something made of this plastic type today. PET is what's used to make bottles for soda, water and other drinks. It's also used to make cooking oil containers, plastic peanut butter jars and containers for other popular food items. Then there is #2. High Density Polyethylene HDPE plastics and are also extremely common. They are used to make milk jugs, shampoo bottles, cleaning product containers and detergent bottles.

After that, all the rest of plastics are pretty much trash. Those grocery bags and wraps are #3 or low density LDPE and do not go in recycling but most grocery stores do accept them. Styrofoam is never recycled. Throw the rest of that plastic, including coffee pods away. As we throw all this plastic away this is a great opportunity to think about what plastic we can eliminate bringing home in the first place. This is very hard but there is often the chance to use paper products instead.

Keep up the good work with glass bottles, steel cans, aluminum cans, clean paper and cardboard. Let's not fall prey to wishful recycling and throwing trash in those yellow bins.






