The Temporary Administrator's Thoughts

*Dear Parishioners, Brothers and Sisters All:*

October is Respect Life Month. Our Church speaks the truth about the sanctity of human life and witnesses to the preciousness of every human person, no matter their position in life, or what they have done. We pray and reflect on these matters in October so that we can witness to the basic right to life and protect life in all of its stages and conditions every day. This is an opportunity for us to reflect on how we think and treat others when we disagree with them or when they have offended or frightened us: the child not willingly conceived, the addict, the prisoner, the immigrant, the bothersome neighbor, the person caught in poverty, the unemployed, the under employed, the frail vulnerable elderly, the parishioner or priest with whom we disagree. Our conduct towards these persons and so many others reveals the value that we put on human life, and our commitment to honor and protect God's precious gift of life. To respect each person's life, to lift up the dignity of every person, to protect the most vulnerable, especially those with a lifetime ahead of them and those with more memories than days to make more of them, to treat all with charity and respect, to work to develop every person to their fullest potential, is to speak to the heart and conscience of our nation and culture that it may learn the value and the dignity of each human person through the witness of our lives. Let us pray this month that we may be faithful witnesses to the sanctity and the preciousness of each human person every day. May the message of our lives teach our world and culture to care for and cherish human life in all of its stages and conditions. This is the greatest statement of respect of life that we could give.

In his encyclical, **Laudato Si, the Care for our Common Home**, Pope Francis makes the point that care for creation involves much more than good stewardship of earth, sky, and sea. It also involves caring for human persons because we too are God's creations. We are stewards of one another because we have the same origin and destiny, the loving presence of God. We are to help one another along our earthly pilgrimage by being a living human experience of God's love for us. That can be a challenge but God has loved us first and gives us the grace to remind one another that he loves us always.

I know many of you have decided to withdraw from your ministries and withhold financial support from the parish because you are angry and frustrated over the circumstances surrounding Fr. Andy's resignation as pastor, and your dissatisfaction over the way that you perceive the Archdiocese has addressed this situation. Ask yourself this. Who are you hurting when you stop taking communion to the sick and home bound? When you cut your contribution to the poor box who are you hurting? When you stop your financial support of your parish's life and ministry who suffers? Only yourself, the persons with whom you have a ministerial relationship and friendship, and the vitality of the parish you love suffer. Now is not the time to inflict anger. It is the time to be good stewards of one another. Think about it.
