HOLY FAMILY

Dear Holy Family:

"What do I tell my kids?" I heard this question at the Town Hall meeting last week and it has been on my heart and mind since. As our parish tried to make sense of Father Andy's resignation, parents were faced with explaining this to their children. As the youth minister at Holy Family, anything to do with young people is always close to my heart. However, this resonated even more because I am a new parent. My son Ethan is just a couple years away from the infamous "why" phase, which means Emily and I will have to find ways to help him understand the world. I realized that I will not always have adequate answers. Things happen that I struggle to make sense of myself, and I am sure Ethan will ask about them. Some will be playful like "why are the Redskins so bad?," to which I can laugh and cheer for them anyway. However, the more serious questions like "why did that person we love have to die?" I will really struggle with. I believe "Why did Father Andy have to leave?" falls somewhere in the middle.

As you know, Archbishop Lori has accepted Father Andy's request to have his resignation reversed and has returned as our pastor (**HOORAY!!!**). It may seem unnecessary to address this now, but I am sure our kids will still ask hard questions. I have only been a parent for a few weeks so I am not trying to tell anyone how to parent. **I still have my training wheels on!** I am simply drawing from my youth ministry experience and sharing what I hope to tell Ethan when he asks me these questions. Here we go:

- ◆ **He is loved!** I want Ethan to know that no matter what happens, Emily and I love him. More importantly, I want him to know that God loves him more than we do. **Hard to imagine, because we love that kid so much!** There is no situation that will ever change these realities.
- ◆ **He is not alone!** He is loved and therefore he is not alone. We will be there for Ethan as long as we are able, however God will **ALWAYS** be there. God does not abandon his beloved, and we are his beloved. Ethan is His beloved. I want Ethan to know Jesus walks with him in any hardship.
- ◆ **Prayer Helps!** Prayers are always answered, even if it's not how we imagined. More importantly, prayer brings us closer to God which means closer to peace, joy and love. Even if prayer means yelling at God because you are so angry. He is a big God, He can take it. Prayer will always help. I hope Ethan will turn to prayer when times are tough.
- ◆ **It will be ok!** God can turn anything into something beautiful if we trust Him with it. When Jesus died, He entrusted His suffering to His Father. Now we celebrate the beauty of Jesus rising from the dead every Sunday! If He can turn Jesus' suffering into saving us from sin, what can He do with ours? Whether it is the death of a loved one or transition of a loved pastor, I want Ethan to be able to offer his suffering to God, so that God can turn it into something beautiful.

It was great to see joy in our parish and great to hear laughter in the office again this past week. However, Father Andy pointed out in his letter that we still have healing to do as a parish. As we start the journey of healing and take on any hardship of life, I think it is important for us to remember and to teach our kids we are loved, we are not alone, prayer will help, and God will make it ok!


