Dear Friends,

This weekend at all the Masses, we will be preaching about the issue of Respect for Life and the Dignity of each person. This is a chance to look at how we put the belief we have that every person is made by God and valued by God into action as Catholics. Whether it is over the issue of abortion or health care or the poor or having to do with Assisted Suicide. All of these issues, in the mind of the Church, are all related to the notion of the dignity each person has simply because God has made us.

Today in the Gospel (Mt. 22) reading we see the Pharisees and the Herodians (groups of like-minded people within the Jewish community in Jesus's time) **"plotting"** to **"entrap"** Him. Faith, because it is so important to one who has found it, can end up becoming contentious. Yet, this is the hope of our Savior, Jesus who wanted us to be united in faith, hope, love and charity.

On October 31st, we recall the 500th anniversary of a difficult time in the Church. The time when Martin Luther, then a 33-year-old priest in Germany, nailed some protests onto a Church door. That action ushered in a time of great divisions over faith in Europe.


While our disagreements with our Lutheran brothers and sisters continue: **1.** We want to always remember Jesus' call to love one another and to have charity. **2.** There have been a lot of Ecumenical strides made to bring Catholics and Lutherans and some other denominations into conversation on beliefs since 1517. One important document was the **"Joint Declaration on the Doctrine of Justification"** released in 1999 after talks between leadership at the highest level in the Catholic Church and the Lutheran community. It came up with a common statement about how we are saved. That we are, ultimately, saved by the grace of God, not by our works. That our good works show that we have truly taken the grace from God into our hearts versus simply giving lip service to following the Lord Jesus. Let us pray, in the future, for continued dialogue and that one day we will be one again. That we would be like the Lord who loved his disciples not like those who plotted against those with whom they disagreed.

◆ **This Sunday, October 22nd, after the 11am Mass, we will gather in the Church for a living rosary** with each person offering an intention for anyone or for a situation and then leading a Hail Mary or Our Father. You can write your intentions on the slips of cloth on the table in the Narthex and tie them to the display. **YOUR** intentions will also be lifted up during our living rosary.

◆ The Living Rosary will be the beginning of a **9-day parish-wide novena to "OUR LADY UNDOER OF KNOTS"** in which we will be asking the Virgin Mary to pray for us to follow her Son Jesus, and to have the love and grace of Jesus to work on the **"knots"** in our lives. 
