Last year, I tried to buy this style of vestment from the Canadian company which created them but unfortunately, the company had closed. Recently, I contacted Fr. Brian Nolan, the new pastor at St. Ignatius since July 1, 2023 asking him if our parish could buy these vestments since Fr. Brian is much taller than I am. Fr. Brian agreed to sell the vestments to our parish. I thank the parishioners who last year donated funds to purchase these vestments and other vestments for our parish.



Caring For Creation

As winter approaches, some of us will gain a little peace of mind as the various water snakes in our region go into hibernation. The most common water snakes that we will see are the brown water snake, common water snake and the southern water snake. There is also the banded water snake often confused with a copperhead.

None of the water snakes are poisonous, but they will bite, if confronted and that could hurt. So, I tend to give them wide birth like most wildlife. Moving equipment or walking in the shore grasses still might disturb them till it gets a little cooler. So, sleep tight for the next few months till spring knowing those snakes are not going to get you...

Deacon Doug's Q&A

QUESTION: After Jesus left his hometown of Nazareth, what town became the center of his public ministry in Galilee?

Answer to the question, what is a reredos?: A reredos is a decorative screen above and behind the altar but structurally separate from the altar. The tabernacle is held in the reredos. In many older and large churches, especially in Europe, the reredos often covered the wall, and might be extravagantly decorated with statue niches, painted panels, and highly carved stone or wood pinnacles. The wooden reredos in our church was built and positioned in 2003.


