# Deacon Doug's Q&A

#### QUESTION: What is Canon Law?

Answer to the question about the Prayer to St. Michael after Mass: St. Michael the Archangel prayer is a short but powerful prayer in defense against both societal evils and personal sin. In the wake of concerns about church unity and new revelations of the sexual abuse of children by clergy, Pope Francis in 2018 invoked the prayer and suggested it be recited at the end of Mass. The Prayer is now a staple of liturgies in many parishes, often recited at the end of Mass or immediately after dismissal.
