

Caring For Creation



They will always remind me of my mom. She loved growing amaryllis in the winter time. They come in little kits with everything we need and will bloom in the darkness of winter when we need cheering up the most.

I see red, I see white, and wow I even see red and white flowers. There are often paperwhites in little kits as well. After following the instructions and keeping the included soil in the pot damp, the bulb will begin to grow. The leaves will grow amazingly fast, like a quarter of an inch a day. Eventually the sprout, including the flower inside comes up. So check out your hardware store or grocery store for the little kits, and bring a little joy to windowsill this winter. *Chris Gordon, OFS*

Deacon Doug's Q&A

QUESTION: Advent begins next week, December 3rd. On the Advent wreath, each candle is a symbol of the stages of salvation. What are these stages?

Answer to the question, what is Canon Law: It is the body of rules, 1752 of them, by which the Church organizes and governs herself. "Canon" basically means rule. It includes both divine law and ecclesiastical (church) law. Divine law is unchangeable and is applicable to every human being — for example, the law against murder. Ecclesiastical law is rooted in Church law and is not infallible, although it is authoritative — for example, requirements for marriage or church offices and other religious practices.
