Pastor's Note

Last year, on Christmas Eve, our 30 plus years old heating system broke and it was very cold in the church that night and on the following Christmas morning. During Christmas week, technicians were able to get our heating system to work again but they told us that it could not be "patched" again due to its age and the problem of finding the necessary replacement parts.

Hearing this news, the Finance Committee Members, the Parish Council Members and our two parish Lay Corporators and I made a decision to purchase a new HVAC system for our church. After putting the project out for bid and receiving three bids, we selected Fresh Air Concepts bid of \$630,000.

On May 1st, we began a cathedraticum (church tax) free campaign (meaning that every dollar raised will go to the project) to raise funds to pay for the new HVAC system. To date, having started with \$50,000 from our parish reserve fund, we have raised \$301,274.76 or 56% of our goal. I thank the parishioners who have contributed to this tax free fund.

The new HVAC System is working properly and this system now gives our parish the flexibility to go quickly from heating to cooling our church and vice versa as the temperature changes greatly in a short period of time.

Traditionally, the parish depends upon the first collection at our Christmas masses to support the general operations of our parish. In addition to asking you to give generously to the first collection, I ask that you also extend your generosity to the second collection at the Christmas masses and to your year end donations to help us pay for the new HVAC System.

The second purple candle lit on this Second Sunday of Advent represents faith. It is called the *"Bethlehem Candle"* as a reminder of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem. As we continue our journey through Advent, we walk by faith, following the example of Mary and Joseph.

In this bulletin you will find a schedule of opportunities to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation during this Advent Season. If these days and times are not convenient, please contact me to set up a date and time.

Join us for a joyous morning at Breakfast with Santa next Sunday, Dec. 17th in Unity Hall after the 8:30am and 10:30am Masses. I thank my brother Knights of Columbus for providing this festive event for the children of our parish. For more information see the ad on pg. 3 of this bulletin or go to our website.

Caring For Creation



Oh those leaves! Well, they are just about done. The leaves have been coming down for a couple of weeks now. Many of them coming from my neighbors yard. But that's OK. We own them where they fall. Get it, fall? I do like to

rake up the leaves off the grass. We have quite a bit of area which is under the tree canopy and has no grass. For the most part, the leaves will stay there till Spring. Why, you might ask? There are a lot of insects that are hibernating in the leaf litter. I can see the Carolina Wrens and other birds rooting around in the leaves looking for a meal. This undisturbed area will be a food source all winter long. It's only when the snow falls that feeders become critically important. So, if you can leave some leaves in your flowerbeds or other wild areas, you too can help our wildlife survive another cold winter.
