Pastor's Note

Last year, on Christmas Eve, our 30 plus years old heating system broke and it was very cold in the church that night and on the following Christmas morning. During Christmas week, technicians were able to get our heating system to work again but they told us that it could not be "patched" again due to its age and the problem of finding the necessary replacement parts.

Hearing this news, the Finance Committee Members, the Parish Council Members and our two parish Lay Corporators and I made a decision to purchase a new HVAC system for our church. After putting the project out for bid and receiving three bids, we selected Fresh Air Concepts' bid of \$630,000.

On May 1st, we began a cathedraticum (church tax) free campaign (meaning that every dollar raised will go to the project) to raise funds to pay for the new HVAC system. To date, having started with \$50,000 from our parish reserve fund, we have raised \$351,274 or 56% of our goal. I thank the parishioners who have contributed to this tax free fund.

The new HVAC System is now working properly and it gives our parish the flexibility to change quickly from heating to cooling our church and vice versa as the temperature changes greatly in a short period of time. In past years, for example, it took two days to change the system from heating to air conditioning.

Traditionally, the parish depends upon the first collection at our Christmas Masses to support the general operations of our parish. In addition to asking you to give generously to this first collection, I ask that you also extend your generosity to the second collection at the Christmas Masses and to your year end donations to help us pay for the new HVAC System.

This Sunday, the Third Sunday of Advent, is called Guadete Sunday. We light the third candle, the rose candle, because the color rose is the liturgical color signifying joy. The rose candle reminds us of the joy which the world experienced at the birth of Jesus Christ and our growing joy as Christmas draws closer.

In this bulletin there is a schedule of opportunities to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation during this Advent Season. If these days and times are not convenient, please contact me to set up a date and time.

Last Christmas a little under 2,500 persons attended the Masses here on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. Planning ahead, we want to warmly welcome all who will be joining us to celebrate Christ's birth this year. If you are a parishioner who is planning to attend one of our Christmas Masses, I ask you to please be a greeter at one of the entrances to our church or outside Unity Hall, providing a hospitable welcome to everyone as they enter before Mass. In addition, greeters will hand out the Christmas programs and provide directions (ex., to the restrooms). 

Deacon Doug's Q&A

QUESTION: The Church celebrates three different Masses on Christmas. What are they and how are they different?

Answer to the question about who was the first Santa Claus: "Santa Claus" is old English name, popularized in the US 200 years ago, for Saint Nicholas whose Feast Day was December 6. As Bishop of Myra in southern Turkey in the 4th Century, Nicholas became the subject of legends for giving away all his inherited wealth to help the poor and sick. The best-known story is how he saved three poor sisters from being sold into slavery by their father by throwing a bag of gold coins through a window, providing them with a dowry so that they could be married. By the Renaissance (1500), St. Nicholas was the most popular saint in Europe.
