~ Pastor's Note ~

I share with you an update on Seminarian Shiadrik Mokum, who our parish is sponsoring while he is attending seminary. This June, Shiadrik successfully completed his Pastoral Year of formation at St. John the Evangelist Parish in Severna Park. By the time you read this note, Shiadrik will have hopefully returned from a month long visit to his native country of Cameroon, spending time with his family who he has not seen in the past two and a half years. In mid-August Shiadrik will return to Mount St. Mary's Seminary in Emmittsburg, MD. for his Third Year of Theology.

In the Spring of 2024, Shiadrik is looking forward to being ordained as a Transitional Deacon and being assigned to minister in a parish on weekends as he completes his Fourth Year of Theology at the Mount. In the Spring of 2025, he will be ordained a priest and assigned to serve in a parish in our Archdiocese of Baltimore.

Shiadrik will be here at Holy Family before he returns to Seminary in mid-August. Please keep him in your prayers as he continues his formation to be ordained a priest.

Lastly, at the start of the Covid Pandemic, the sharing of the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ was stopped. Communion will now be offered under both species, the Body and the Blood of Jesus Christ at all Masses. If you have a cold or are feeling under the weather, I would ask you to not receive from the chalice.

HVAC CAMPAIGN: Due to the July 4th holiday and early bulletin submission, there will not be an update in this bulletin for the weekend of July 1st & 2nd. Once again as of Sunday, June 25th, we have received \$81,344.12. These gifts, combined with the \$50,000 from our reserve fund, gives us a total of \$131,344.12 or 21% towards our goal of \$630,000! We are tracking our parish's progress in our HVAC Campaign with the two red thermometers in our narthex. The thermometers are on the two brick walls on the far right or left of the double doors that lead into our Church.

THANK YOU FOR YOUR SUPPORT! Every dollar given during this two year campaign is cathedraticum free, which means every dollar will go toward the purchase and installation of our new HVAC System. 
