December Events and Activities

Most of the 90 students who had prepared participated in First Reconciliation on December 6 at 10 a.m. with six priests available.

Elementary Faith Formation students raised over \$200 in quarters so that Winter Relief participants could do laundry.

Middle School Faith Formation students provided items for bag lunches for Winter Relief guests during the entire week.

First graders worked at home as a family to create Nativity scenes. Students made presentations to their classmates and discussed how they created the scenes as well as what they and their families learned during the experience. The project provided the opportunity for families to discuss the true story and meaning of Christmas. Families made many comments as they brought the dioramas into the classrooms. Comments included what they wanted to be sure to include in the scene. The Nativities are on display until December 21 in the lobby area near the Religious Ed office. Council members are encouraged to view the work of our students whose imaginations helped them choose materials from marshmallows to Legos.

The Nativity Pageant will be presented on December 21 after the 11 a.m. mass. All choirs are working to provide a musical program. A cookie reception is planned following the pageant. Annamary Holbrook and Monica Felter have been rehearsing the students.

Our children and their families contributed 93 shoe boxes for Operation Christmas Child.

Ms. Graham and I (and possibly others) will attend Nativity Church on Sunday, December 21 to observe personally how this church uses music and theater to engage their youth.

January Plans

The First Communion parent meeting is planned for Tuesday, January 6 at 7 p.m. in the church. Classes will take place the week of January 21.

A Catechist Retreat, designed by all of the Anne Arundel County DREs is scheduled for Saturday, January 24 from 9 a.m. til noon at Holy Trinity Catholic Church. The \$7 participant cost will be paid by our parish. Fr. Tony Adawu will present "A Church of Children," looking at the church through the eyes of a child. Mass and confession will be available. A lite fare of breakfast items will be provided to participants as they check in.

Recommendations

I recommend that we do more to encourage participation in Catechist training. Waiving the fee is a good start. I don't believe that our volunteers should have to pay to become more proficient at their volunteer positions. I have suggested to Ms. Graham that in the future we do more to "promote" these enrichment opportunities rather than just announce them. This could include learning more about the actual proposed content and including this in information provided to our Catechists, offering to organize car pools, considering paying for the optional lunch, providing a follow up report to all of our Catechists highlighting important points made by speakers, and copying hand outs for distribution to those who could not attend.
